This grant is a 100% reimbursement grant which will allow for replacing the existing system of patchwork cameras with an up-to-date standardized system at no cost to the Village. The cameras are currently on order and should arrive within the next 4 weeks.

The testing and interviews for full-time patrol should be completed in April.

The 1st quarter juvenile log and survey were completed and submitted to the ODYS.

Officers continue to receive training in an effort to meet the 24-hour CPT requirements for 2022.
