Monthly Activity and Community Policing Report – December 2022

EPPD Officers either met or exceeded the 24-hour CPT requirements for 2022 - all documentation has been submitted to OPOTA ahead of the January 31st deadline.

Ptl. Sattler continues the SRO program for the 2022/2023 school year.

Officers provided security for the home basketball games.

The East Palestine Police Officers Association raised **\$3,855.00** as a result of this years “No Shave November” fundraising event. The funding was used to purchase Christmas gifts for 18 children this Holiday season.

We have signed a contract to correct the flooding issues/water damage in the PD basement. Once the water has dissipated and the mold remediated, the Police Association will build the necessary walls for the addition of two offices. These offices will help create much needed space however, we will need to address this issue further in the coming months.

The EPPD - OCJS wages grant has been recommended for funding and we are currently submitting the pre-award conditions.

We have applied for OCJS grant funding which will allow us to recruit up to two (2) uncertified police officer candidates. If received, this grant funding will pay the costs associated with the Police Academy. Those who are selected will be required to sign a pre-employment agreement with the Village ensuring they will remain employed here for three to four years.
