Officers continue to take annual training through OPOTA – 24 hours of CPT is required in 2023.

Chief Brown is working with the Ohio Collaborative to recertify the department in the following policies and practices. Use of Force, Recruiting and Hiring, Safe Policing for Safe Communities, Body Worn Cameras, Community Engagement and Telecommunicator standards. Provisional certification has been granted with final certification expected soon.
